Cuban Exiles to Broaden Campaign Against Castro

MIAMI, Fla., May 8 (AP)— The Cuban Revolutionary Council announced today that it was expanding its campaign against Premier Fidel Castro despite its loss of United States Government subsidy.

The Government severed ties with the council after its president, José Miró Cardona, resigned and condemned the way the United States handled Cuban affairs.

"The fact that the United States has ceased its support is no obstacle to our struggle for liberation of Cuba," the council said. The coalition, now eaded by Antonio Maceo, embraces six revolutionary groups. Pedro Martinez Fraga, former Ambassador to Washington; Dr. Manuel Antonio de Varona, and Dr. Ernesto Freyre are other leaders.
