### **CUBA EXECUTES 3 AS C. I. A. AGENTS**

HAVANA, Aug. 17 (UPI)—The Cuban Government announced today that it had executed three persons it said were agents of the United States Central Intelligence Agency sent here to organize military espionage and sabotage.

The executions were carried out by a firing squad in Las Villas Province at dawn yesterday, but the announcement did not say when the men had been tried.

The Government declared that the three men were members of an infiltration group captured July 22 in Cayo Verde, a small key off the province's northern coast.

The men were identified as Rolando Matheus Paz and

Manuel and Francisco Marrero Castillo.

The announcement said the group had been sent to Cuba in a C.I.A. boat and had been transferred to a small boat that took it to Cayo Verde, where its members were captured by revolutionary forces.

The men carried weapons, material for secret writing, money and a list of former big landowners and former members of the army during the regime of the ousted dictator, Fulgencio Batista, according to the announcement.
