EXILES SAY SOVIET STILL ARMS CUBANS

MIAMI, July 20 (AP)—The Cuban Revolutionary Council said today that Soviet arms continued to pour into Cuba, the Chinese Communists had become interrogators for Cuba's military intelligence service and that the Russians wore Cuban army uniforms in increasing numbers.

The council said underground agents reported Soviet vessels arriving at various ports. It said one ship docked at Mariel and that huge boxes were transferred to trucks driven and guarded by soldiers. The boxes were similar to those that contained missiles at the same port before the crisis of last October, the council declared.

MIAMI, July 20 (UPI)—A new Cuban exile organization says it is planning extensive military actions against the regime of Premier Fidel Castro.

Carlos Alberto Montaner, a leader of the Cuban Military Units, said yesterday that the anti-Castro actions would be started from a secret base in the Caribbean. But he denied published reports the group had 400 guerrillas training in Nicaragua.

Mr. Montaner said most of his men had joined the United States Army and received special training.
