F.B.I. SEIZES BOMBS LINKED TO CUBA RAID

MANDEVILLE, La. July 31 (AP)—Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation raided a house in a resort section near here today and seized more than a ton of dynamite and 20 bomb casings.

An informed source said the explosives were part of a cache to be used in an attack on Cuba by foes of Premier Fidel Castro.

But the F.B.I. would only say that the materials were "seized in connection with an investigation of an effort to carry out a military operation from the United States against a country with which the United States is at peace."

The 20 empty 100-pound bombs

were stored in the porch of a dwelling in the Forest Glen addition to the subdivision of Lacombe Park, the F.B.I. said.

Also seized were paraphernalia for assembling fuses, 25 pieces of primer cord, 24 commercial-type percussion blasting caps and a 50-pound container of a thickener used to make a jelly-like substance out of gasoline.

The explosives, 48 cases of 60

The explosives, 48 cases of 60 per cent dynamite, each weighing 50 pounds, were stored in a trailer parked adjacent to the house

The F.B.I. declined to identify the owner of the house or to say whether any arrests had been made.
