STRONGER MEASURES TO FREE CUBA URGED

MIAMI BEACH, Sept. 8.—Stronger measures to free Cuba from the Castro regime were demanded today in a forum at the American Legion's 45th annual convention. It was held by the Legion's National Security and Foreign Relations Commissions.

The forum heard a panel composed of Senator Kenneth B. Keating, Republican, of New York; Luis A. Somoza Debayle, former President of Nicaragua; John Hugh Crimmins, Coordinator of Cuban Affairs, of the State Department, and Emilio Rodriguez, representing Cuban exiles.

Senator Keating called for a tight economic embargo against Cuba and charged that United States policy against Premier Fidel Castro was "half-hearted."

Mr. Somoza Debayle said it was "impossible to speak of hemispheric unity and solidarity" as long as Dr. Castro and the Soviet Union remained in Cuba.
