Youth With Knife Forces U.S. Jet With 47 Aboard to Land in Cuba

MIAMI—A National Airlines jet en route from Key West to Miami with 47 persons aboard was hijacked to Cuba yesterday by a young male passenger who held a stewardess at knifepoint.

The plane was the ninth hijacked this year and the sixth U.S. commercial jet to be forced to fly to Cuba since Jan. 1.

A Federal Aviation Agency spokesman said the plane left Key West at 3:37 p.m. The pilot radioed four minutes later that there was "a kid with a knife in the cockpit." The jetliner landed safely in Havana at 4:19 p.m.

Sixteen of the 40 passengers were American servicemen, the FAA spokesman said. A State Department spokesman said arrangements for return of the plane and its passengers were under way.
