## JET IS HIJACKED 11-24-68

Four Armed Men Force Havana Landing

MIAMI, Fla. (AP) — Four armed men seized control of an Eastern Airlines jet with 90 per-sons aboard and forced it to fly to Havana Saturday night.

Entering the cockpit while the Chicago-to-Miami flight was over Kentucky, the gunmen or-dered pilot R. B. Silver of Miami to report only that the plane was being hijacked and to seek landing instructions for Havana.

"The pilot said we could not ask him any questions," said Paul Boatman, an ad-ministrator for the Federal Aviation Administration in Miami.

## SIMPLE STATEMENT

Silver reported the hijacking to the FAA in Indianapolis shortly after 7 p.m., about one hour after leaving Chicago.

"The pilot simply told our controller that he was en route to Havana," said James Brom-

ley, FAA flight supervisor in Indianapolis.

"The pilot said there were four armed men on the plane. He then requested a flight plan to Havana," Bromley said. Silver has been an Eastern pi-

lot for 26 years. In Miami Eastern officials identified the other crew members as Guy E. Blake, the first officer, and Andrew De Felice, the second officer, both of Miami, and flight attendants Judith Lashmett, Margo Sunquist, Nancy Corson and Carie Hering, all of Chicago.

An Eastern spokesman said the plane landed in Havana at 8:41 p.m. EST.
