April 13 (UPI)-A Cuban exile leader whose promised invasion of his homeland failed to materialize four years ago was shot to death as he watched television in the living room of his elegant home.

Police said today they had no clues leading to the assailant who Friday night fired through the living room window and fatally wounded former Cuban Agriculture Minister Jose de la Torriente, 69.

A source close to the family said Torriente had recently received a threatening note that was "political" in nature.
