The release of the sailors from the Layla Express and the Johnny Express was arranged by Panamanian mediators. Both ships are registered in Panama but are owned by the Bahama Lines of Miami, a firm operated by a Cuban exile family. Cuba is still holding the ships.

The U.S. Navy disclosed in Norfolk, Va., that it has kept a destroyer on patrol in the Caribbean since the two ships were seized. Although the Pentagon had announced an "increase in surveillance" as a result of Cuba's actions, this was the first time that the nature of such surveillance was disclosed.
