## Cuban Terrorist Probe Pushed

MIAMI (UPI) — A special detective force is continuing the investigation of a Cuban exile terrorist group accused of one political murder and believed involved in a wave of murders and bombings plaguing Miami's Latin colony the past three years.

Culminating 18 months of work, the special squad of Dade County homicide detectives announced yesterday the uncovering of a Miami-based terrorist group of Cuban refugees calling itself the "Pragmatistas."

Six members of the group were arrested and two others were identified as fugitives in connection with the assassination of Luciano Nieves, who was gunned down in a hospital parking lot Feb. 21, 1975, because he had advocated that the United States establish peaceful coexistence with the Fidel Castro regime.

When officers went to the residence of Jose Patricio, 29, to arrest him yesterday, they uncovered a cache of 151 pounds of dynamite, blasting caps and fuses.

The others arrested were identified as Hector Carbonell, 36, a beauty salon owner; Enrico Velasco, 53, a jeweler; Jose Elias Nazin, 56; Guido Carrillo, 34, and Vienbenido Rosaro Lozano.
