Jailed Cuban Exile Leader Called Boaster of Expo Plot

Persistent reports that Fidel Castro intends to visit the Cuban exhibit at Canada's Expo 67 on July 26 may have been one of the factors that impelled the U.S. Immigration and Naturalization Service to put anti-Castro exile activist Felipe Rivero Diaz behind bars.

Informed sources here said the 42-year-old head of the Asociacion Nacionalista Cubana, small but violent exile organization had continued to boast publicly that his men planned to attack the Havana pavilion at Montreal with bazookas and plastic explosives.
