Castro Foes Arrested in Bomb Plot

NEWARK, May 20 (AP)— Two New Jersey members of the Cuban Nationalist Movement, a militant anti-Castro group, were held in lieu of ball today on Federal charges of conspiracy to bomb Cuban government installations and ships in Canada.

They are Guillermo Novo Sampol, 28, of West New York, and Felipe Martinez y Blanca, 25, of Union City. The men were arrested by the FBI at heir homes and arraigned before U.S. Commissione Thomas W. Clohosey.

Clohosey set bail for Sampol at \$50,000 and for Blanca at \$25,000. Both were turned over to the custody of a U.S., marshal when they failed to post bail.

The FBI said both are Cuban natives and naturalized citizens of the United States.

FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover announced in Washington the two had conspired with others to destroy the offices of the Cuban consulate and the Cuban Trade Commission, and steamships belonging to Cuba.

The complaint, filed here Monday, charged them with conspiracy to injure property of a foreign government.

Conviction carries a maximum penalty of three years' imprisonment and a \$5000 fine.
