MIAMI, Fla. AP - Six Cuban exiles have been named in federal indictments charging that they conspired to drop bombs on ships loaded with supplies for Communist Cuba.

The grand jury said Wednesday the group practiced bombing missions out of Miami and conspired to bomb British, Canadian and Spanish ships "or any others loaded with supplies for Cuba."

Named in the indictment were Orlando Bosch, Marcos Rodriguez Ramos, Barbara Balan Garcia, Louis Bertot, Jose Antonio Mulet and Jose Diaz Morejón.

Bosch, head of the Insurreccional Recovery Movement, was found innocent last year of a charge of threatening death to other Cuban exiles unless they gave him money to fight Fidel Castro.

Asst. U.S. Atty. Donald Bierman said the arrests were made last January when two of the men attempted to board a plane loaded with three 100-pound bombs, three one-gallon jugs of an incendiary mixture and guns and ammunition.
