

Blast Damages Anti-Castro Former Office

MIAMI, Fla. (AP) — A bomb blast in the Little Havana section damaged several buildings, including former quarters of the anti-Castro organization Alpha 66, police said.

Capt. Tom Brodie of the Metro bomb squad said the blast apparently was caused by dynamite.

Damage was reported at 11:30 a.m. Police said windows were blown out and awnings were damaged at a jewelry store formerly occupied by the Alpha 66 organization, a restaurant and a tobacco company.

The charge was placed on the ground outside the buildings, police said.

Since January, a chain of explosions has rocked the Little Havana section where thousands of Cuban exiles from the Fidel Castro regime live.
