## 9 Cubans Seized After Bombings

NEW YORK (AP) — Nine Cuban nationalists have been arrested in connection with a series of at least 14 bombings of military, foreign consulates and tourist offices during a recent four-month period, Dist. Atty. Frank S. Hogan announced today.

Alfred J. Scotti, chief assistant district attorney, said the nine were members of the Cuban Revolutionary Council, a group of Cuban exiles in Miami.

The nine were picked up by New York City police early today.

That this part of the alleged plan was to be initiated shortly.

The indictments charged the bombing and destroying of buildings were used to trade with Cuba and those vessels belonging to Cuba.

of more than 10 in bombings were tourist or diplomatic offices of countries trading with Cuba. Most of the bombings occurred at night when no one was about.

But one daylight explosion at the Japanese National Tourist Organization in Rockefeller Center last July 7 injured a woman tourist and her daughter.

Scotti said that the first phase of the bombing of the political offices of those nations that maintained trade relations with Cuba.

Havana pediatrician was spokesman for the group, which began activities about the first of the year. He was identified in the indictment as being the mysterious "Bosch" — a name frequently signed to communiques in which the group took responsibility for bombings.

Bosch and two others specifically were charged with causing a Cuban freighter in Miami harbor.
