On November 26, 1963, Mrs. LOUISE GATES, 7527 Northeast Second Avenue, Miami, Florida, contacted the Miami Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and stated Mrs. MARJORIE RUDD, resident at 103rd Street and Northwest Tenth Avenue, Miami, told her that LEE HARVEY OSWALD was involved in a demonstration in downtown Miami. Mrs. RUDD had further stated, according to Mrs. GATES, that OSWALD had been picked up by the Miami Police, but no charges were placed against him.

On November 29, 1963, Mrs. MARJORIE RUDD BRAZIL, 1025 Northwest 103rd Street, Miami, Florida, stated she had heard the rumor that LEE HARVEY OSWALD had been in Miami through a Cuban acquaintance, whose name she declined to divulge, stating he is afraid to be involved because his family is still in Cuba. She said he had claimed that OSWALD was among the pickets who demonstrated at the offices of the Cuban Revolutionary Council (CRC) on Biscayne Boulevard in Miami. She said she recalled the incident generally, and the fact that there was rock throwing and some arrests made.

On recontact, November 29, 1963, Mrs. BRAZIL stated she requested her Cuban acquaintance, and he admitted to her that he had no personal knowledge that OSWALD had been in Miami, but that he had heard such talk on the street.

The CRC, until April of 1963, was a leading anti-CASTRO organization at Miami, headed by Dr. JOSE MIRO CARDONA, formerly a Law Professor at the University of Havana.

On February 21, 1963, Mr. DONALD POMERLEAU, City of Miami Public Safety Director, made available a report of
