Earlier yesterday, FBI agent Cortlandt Cunningham testi-fied that he had conducted ballistics tests on the gun allegedly used in the shooting.

He said the bullets removed from the senator and the ones he test-fired from the gun had many of the same characteristics, but that it was impossible to say positively that the gun placed in evidence was the gun used in the shooting.
