

Warren Probe Not Complete, Should Continue, Prelate Says

"I never believed it was the work of one man. The Warren Commission should follow through. The investigation is not complete."

The subject was the assassination of John F. Kennedy, the speaker Richard Cardinal Cushing, archbishop of Boston, and the words caused a small sensation at a press conference called to announce a \$50 million fund drive.

The cardinal spoke deliberately, and while he indicated this was a personal opinion, he suggested the commission might do well to examine the documents and tapes being assembled for the Kennedy Memorial Library.

That material, he noted, includes transcripts of tapes he made of his relations with President Kennedy, and also of such world figures as Khrushchev, DeGaulle, Salazar of Portugal and Franco of Spain.

Those figures were asked for comment, he said, on what Kennedy had accomplished during his brief administration, and what he did not accomplish that he should have.

His own reminiscences fill 54 typewritten pages, but their substance will not be revealed "until I am dead."

The cardinal said, however, that he was asked such ques-

tions as whether Kennedy customarily kissed his episcopal ring, what kind of a Catholic the late President was, what was his religious life?

The cardinal, who gave the

invocation at the Kennedy inauguration, and then presided at the funeral of the assassinated President, returned Wednesday after blessing the
