this diagram illustrates part of the research of Harold Weisberg, Frederick, MD, a distinguished and by far the most prolific of the Warren Report critics

In his book Post Mortem he analyzes testimony of Dr Charles Carrico, published in the Commission's Hearings vol III, pp 361-2. In answering a question by Allen Dulles the doctor locates the President's wound of entry in the throat above the shirt collar. Both Representatives Hale Boggs and Gerald Ford were present during this interchange yet there is no mention of this cardinal fact in the Commission's Report.

This is as good a place as any to start an investigation.... must the Select Committee on Assassinations be itself assassinated so soon after its painful experience of birth?

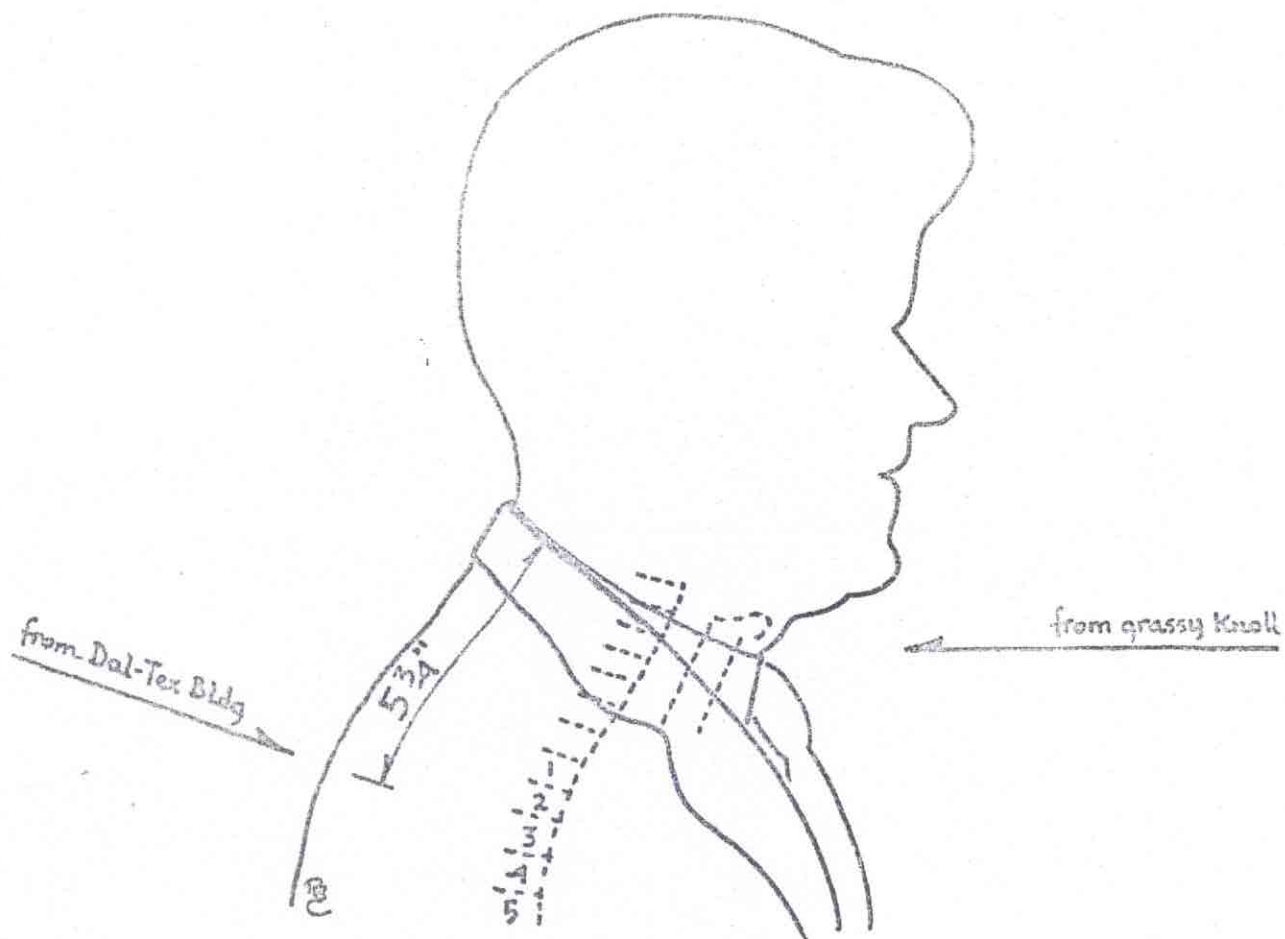

 occurred at Z-188  
 above shirt collar and  
 below Adam's apple
