What is not easy to believe is how difficult it now is, at least up here, to get an old-fashioned typewriter ribbon. That is why everything I've been doing has been so pale. Properly used, and in context, not the usual critic one-shot that has been so counterproductive (witness the police tapes in Paul's current mailing that I only began while a miting the podiatrist's call) this can be exceptionally powerful stuff. While I've never net them or spoken to them, I might be willing to trust Shaffer or Stern. Isn't one in Overdorfer's old firm?

If nothing else happens it ought not beg too long before there is a hearing under the remand. The first thing I'll want to do, and I'll want to do it pointedly, is move for recusal.
