Dear Miss Di Palo:

Thank you for your letter which I am taking the liberty of answering for my husband. He is always more than pleased to hear from people, particularly when the letters are as friendly and complimentary as yours.

The first printing of the book was for a total of 5,000 copies. We went back to press not quite three weeks ago for another 5,000, of which we have approximately 1,000 left.

The address on the back of the book is complete. We live in the country and don't have door delivery of mail. We pick it up at the post office, where there is one incoming and one outgoing mail each day.

There is a possibility my husband will again appear on the Alan Burke show, but as yet it is not definite. There has been some tentative discussion of it. Tomorrow night, August 12, he will be in Philadelphia for his second appearance on WCAU (CBS-radio), which lasts from 10 p.m. to 2 a.m.

He stays very busy, and whenever he can squeeze it in, works on another book to follow WHITEWASH.
