A month from today it will be 35 years ago that President John F. Kennedy was assassinated in Dallas, Texas. I was 14 at the time, and little did I know that the strangeness of it all would never let me rest again. As I learned from your excellent book "Never Again" this dramatic event changed your life in a far more drastic way.

Ofcourse I knew that you were among the first critics of the Warren Report. But I only learned through newspaper reports or quotations a small portion of what you wrote in your "Whitewash" books. Except for your 1995 book "Never Again!" I was never able to obtain in Holland a copy of any of your other publications.
