Thank you very much.

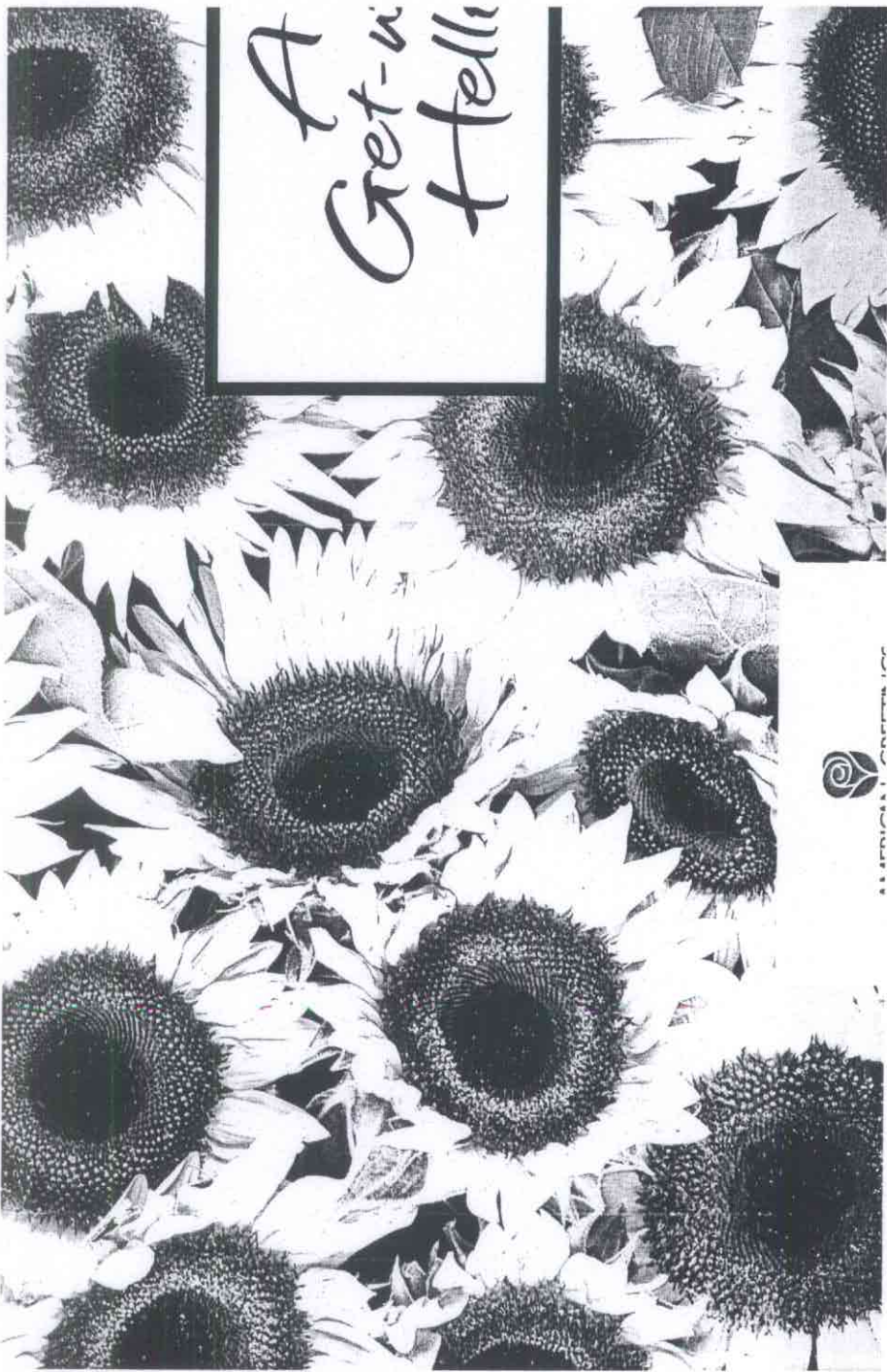
