Another 100,000 words on Kennedy

ONDON publisher Peter Owen is grappling with the ultimate in Kennediana: A book by Harold Welsberg, who is reported to be the source of most of the information with which New Orleans District Attorney Jim Garrison has been conducting

his Perry Mason-style investigation of the Kennedy assassination.

Weisberg, a former intelligence analyst and Congressional investigator, has already published three works on the assassination:

Whitewash — the Report on the Warren Report;

Whitewash II;
Oswald in New Orleans. It was this last which is reported to have given

Garrison sufficient basic information to put together a case fit to stand up in court.

A CASE which three judges have decided is strong enough to merit further consideration.

A CASE which has made President Johnson himself consider the possibility of a Federal follow-up to the Warren Commission.

The Owen book will be more than a mere rehash of Weisberg's previously put ished works.

For Weisberg is preparing a collection of documents to support his thesis that the Kennedy assassination was not the work of Oswald but of a conspiracy.

These documents will be incorporated in the book, which will be completely new, and 100,000 words long.

Publication will of course, depend on the outcome of the legal proceedings initiated by Garrison.

Owen told Inside Page yesterday that he planned to have the book ready for publication in October or November.
