On 12/18/67 Mrs. IRVING (ANITA) GEWERTZ, 6422 Walnut Hill Lane, and 7125 Northhaven, both Dallas, Texas, telephonically contacted the writer concerning what she believed was ~~front line~~ ^{fraudulent} use of a film she and a group of individuals had prepared concerning events leading up to the assassination on 11/22/63 (Dallas Cinema Associates was the name of the group formed and complete information is contained in the reports in captioned matter concerning same). Mrs. GEWERTZ became emotionally upset during this conversation and she had previously been told by the writer when she made inquiries about people following her that she should report any fear for her own safety to the local PD and that if she felt legal action should be taken against other individuals who were involved in the Dallas Cinema Associates she should consult an attorney of her own choosing, as the information she had did not indicate a violation of Federal law.

On 12/21/67, Mrs. GEWERTZ appeared at the Dallas Office of the FBI carrying a handbag containing numerous newspaper clippings and copies of data relating to the assassination which she stated she had obtained from the National Archives and through correspondence with individuals interested in the assassination. While discussing this matter she again indicated she feared for her life because of the preparation of the film on the events of 11/22/63 and emotionally broke down. She was politely advised that any fear she had for her own safety should be brought to the attention of the Dallas PD and that in the absence of information indicating a violation of Federal law over which the FBI had jurisdiction, this Bureau could not be of assistance to her.
