KENNEDY ASSASSINATION MEMORABILIA
AUTOGRAPHED BY NICK McDONALD, CAPTOR OF LEE HARVEY OSWALD

The following items are signed by Maurice "Nick" McDonald, the Dallas Police Officer who captured Lee Harvey Oswald after the assassination of JFK. (1) Signature \$10.00; (2) Signed Business Card which pictures a small photo of McDonald, holding Oswald's gun and is imprinted with 7 lines regarding the capture \$20.00; (3) SP, 4x4 1/2 Close Up picturing McDonald holding Oswald's 38 Pistol - Signed "Officer N. Nick McDonald - (Captor of Oswald - 11-22-63) \$25.00; (4) Signed 9x11 Reproduction of the Homicide Report on JFK - ("The expired was riding in motorcycle with wife and Governor John Connally; Oswald's wife. Witness heard gun shot and saw the expired slump forward. More shots were heard and the expired fell into his wife's lap...") - McDonald is listed as the Arresting Officer of the suspect. He has also signed white badge number "1178" - \$25.00; (5) Signed 9x11 Reproduction of the Arrest Report on Oswald ("This man shot and killed President John F. Kennedy and Police Officer J. D. Tippit. He also shot and wounded Governor John Connally") - Also signed "1178" \$25.00; (6) Signed 9x11 Reproduction of Oswald's Fingerprint Card - also signed "1178" \$20.00; (7) A 7-Page Report on the Assassination and Capture of Oswald - Reproduced is the police radio transmission of JFK's shooting, an account of the arrest and 10 photos including McDonald in front of the Texas School Book Depository, the Texas Theater, McDonald pointing to the seat where he captures Oswald, Oswald's Mug Shot, Oswald on the autopsy table, etc. McDonald has Signed 6 Times \$25.00; (8) Signed 4-Page Reproduction of a March 8, 1964 Parade Magazine Cover Story on McDonald - "The Man Who Captured Lee (Oswald)" - Signed 4 Times \$20.00; (9) McDonald's Account of the Capture of Oswald - 2-Page Transcript. 100+ lines ("...I felt him pulling his pistol from underneath his shirt. An Automatic reaction of aggression began with me physically, before my brain commanded me. He brought the pistol up to my chest. I grabbed for it with my left hand and grasped his pistol over the cylinder and hammer, with all the strength I could muster. I could feel the hammer glide under my hand, as he pulled the trigger. The returning hammer made a dull, metallic snapping sound, as the firing pin struck the flesh of my left hand, between the thumb and forefinger. Bracing myself, I stood rigid, waiting for the bullet to penetrate my chest. The bullet beneath the firing pin did not receive the full striking force and slightly denied the primer of the shell. I pivoted his pistol to be side and away from my back, and realized I was not shot. With a clenched fist, I hit him over his left eye, knocking him into the seat. My life depended on gaining complete control of his weapon. I somehow managed to grab the handle of his pistol with my right hand and jerked it away from him. I showed the muzzle into his stomach, and for a fleeting moment, I thought, "He tried to kill me and I'd be justified in killing him!" But...I pulled the pistol away and handed it to a detective standing in the aisle. I called out to my fellow officers, "I've got him!"") - Signed Twice - An important piece of history \$35.00

- 243. Knight, Ted (1923-86) American. Signed Hand Print - Hand drawn 7x9 outline of his hand, signed with a huge Sig. NET \$35.00

Knox, Frank (1874-1944) Powerful Newspaper Owner, 1936 Republican Vice Presidential Candidate & Secretary of Navy during WW II (1940-44) US, Dec. 18, 1936 on his personal stationery - "...the kindly comments which you see fit to say about my part in the campaign are gratifying and deeply appreciated..." Written several weeks after the Lardner-Knox ticket went down to overwhelming defeat in the 1936 election \$50.00
- 245. Kovic, Ron - Vietnam War Vet and author of the bestselling "Born on the Fourth of July" - In Person Sig. -NET \$15.00
- 246. Kuntzler, William (1919-95) Radical Attorney, Lawyer for Martin Luther King during the Civil Rights Struggle. Best remembered for his defense of the Chicago 7. Sig. \$35.00
