SUBJECT is a know associate of Jack Ruby and is a possible witness for the defense in the forth coming trial of Ruby.

T-1 stated SUBJECT is the widow of Lyndall E. Hall. SUBJECT stated in 1960 she was employed by Taylor Publishing Company, 6320 Denton Drive, for the past five years. SUBJECT was born in 1920. Stated SUBJECT has lived at the following addresses; 4731 Mannett, 4303 Mannett, 2709 Hawthorne, 4720 San Marcus and 5620 East Claridge Circle. SUBJECT is presently living at 1606 Pratt Street, Apartment C, telephone WH 3 9783.

T-1 stated SUBJECT has 19 past due accounts in the amount of \$10.00 to \$150.00. Trade is unsatisfactory.

Sir:

District Attorney Henry Wade received information from MR. F. H. HARRISON SR. who lives at 1718 NORTH TRAVIS STREET, LIBERTY, TEXAS, Telephone number FE-6-3543 Area Code 713 that could possibly show a connection between JACK RUBY and LEE HARVEY OSWALD. The following is a result of this investigation.

MR HARRISON stated that he had received information that a guard named CABINESS (fnu) of the Texas Prison System had a negro inmate under his supervision that knew JACK RUBY, and that Ruby had contacted this negro about moving Oswald from Dallas to California, prior to the assassination of President Kennedy.

YERNEATH C. CABINESS, a guard at the Wynne Farm of the TDC, was contacted about the above mentioned negro. Cabiness stated that he knew nothing about this negro. Cabiness stated that what he had said was mis-constructed and that the man we (the undersigned officers) wanted to talk to was BOBBY JOSEPH SIMONS, w-m, who is an inmate at the Wynne Farm.

Simons stated that he had known Ruby for a number of years and that he always thought that Ruby was a communist. Simons also stated that the negro in question was McKINLEY PATTON, c-m, TDC# 169432. Patton told Simons that he had worked for Jack Ruby at the Vegas Club before he went to the penitentiary. Simons stated that Patton said nothing of Ruby asking him to move Oswald to California.

Simons stated that a MILTON TURLINGTON (phonetic), probably knew Ruby better than anyone. Simons stated that Turlington is or was a policeman in Waxahachie, Texas.

SUBJECT: CLAUDE HALLMARK (6)

Sir:

Captain W. P. GANNAWAY received information that the SUBJECT had made a statement that JACK RUBY was in the Allright Parking Garage at 1208 Commerce on the afternoon of November 23, 1963. That JACK RUBY had made a telephone call and had asked for WES WISE at the KRILD T V Station. RUBY was reportedly told that WES WISE was not in and that RUBY had then talked to a person named KEN (fnu). RUBY was reported to have asked this person when LEE HARVEY OSWALD was to be transferred from the City jail to the County jail and had stated to this person, KEN, (fnu), that he wanted to be there when the transfer was made.

A KEN SCOTT, an artist at KRILD T V Station was interviewed and he stated that he had never received a telephone call from JACK Ruby and that he did not talk to Jack Ruby on November 23, 1964.

One KEN SMART, who works the City Desk in the Dallas Times Herald news room was interviewed and stated that he had only talked to Jack Ruby one time in his life, that he could remember, and this was several months prior to November, 1963.

Mr. EDDIE BARKER, News Director at the KRILD T V Station was interviewed and stated that the above two persons are the only ones with the name 'KEN' that he knew and if there were others, they would not be in position to receive telephone calls or dispense any information regarding current events. Eddie Barker and Wes Wise both stated that JACK RUBY had appeared at the scene of the assassination on the afternoon of November 23, 1964. Wes Wise was at this location in one of the KRILD T V Mobil News Units and Jack Ruby came to the side of the unit and engaged Wes Wise in conversation for more than one half hour, discussing the assassination and Lee Harvey Oswald. This was around 1:00 PM in the afternoon.

Page two - Claude Hallmark

Mr. CLAUDE HALLMARK, the manager of Allright Parking Garages was interviewed and first stated that he did not remember any thing about the afternoon of November 23, 1963, except that JACK RUBY did come in the the parking station and that he did use the telephone. He did remember that Jack Ruby had made a telephone call and thought that he had asked for WES WISE and he thought that the name of the person Ruby talked to sounded like 'KEN'. Hallmark stated that he was not sure of just what was said.

Mr. Hallmark was interviewed a second time, by telephone and upon direct questioning, stated that he did not remember RUBY making a statement about the time of Oswald's transfer or on the point that he wanted to be present at the time of the transfer. Mr. Hallmark then changed this and stated that this was referring to Ruby asking questions on the telephone. That as far as he could remember, RUBY did not ask any questions about the Oswald case, his transfer from the city jail to the county jail or the time of the transfer. Mr. Hallmark stated that as he remembered the events of the afternoon, Jack Ruby came into the office of the parking lot and made a remark to the persons present that he was going to make like a reporter. Mr. Hallmark stated that during the time Ruby was on the telephone, he did most of the talking and appeared to be giving information to the other person, the one he was calling, rather than asking questions and receiving information. Hallmark stated that most of the telephone conversation did appear to be dominated by the subject of the Presidents assassination and Leo harvey Oswald but that he did not remember any specific remarks or statements nor did he hear a specific question regarding Lee Harvey's transfer nor the time of the transfer.

Sir:

Pursuant to the instructions of Captain W.P. Gannaway an investigation was conducted regarding SUBJECT and the following report is submitted. This investigation and report is related to the Jack Ruby case.

Source reports that SUBJECT has been receiving telegrams, letters and money orders which are to be used for the defense of Jack Ruby.

SUBJECT is a white male fifty-four (54) years of age. SUBJECT is presently residing at 3227 San Paula with his wife Milna Jean. The telephone number at this address is BR-9-4015.

Confidential informant T-1 states that SUBJECT came to Dallas, Texas from Waco, Texas in 1946. T-1 states that in November of 1961 SUBJECT gave his place of employment as Local 540. Telephone number UA-7-7341. T-1 states that SUBJECT'S credit is considered good. T-1 has no further information regarding SUBJECT.

The indices of the Dallas Police Department Special Service Bureau were searched regarding SUBJECT with the following results. Criminal Intelligence Section File Number Int. 2383-5 reveals that as of July 11, 1955 SUBJECT was the International Representative for Amalgamated Meat Cutters and Butchers Workmen of America, which was at that time located at 2909 Maple Avenue.

The indices of the Dallas Police Department Records Bureau were searched regarding SUBJECT with negative results. This check was for arrests and traffic citations.

The indices of the Dallas Police Department Identification Bureau were searched regarding SUBJECT with the following results. On September 21, 1951 one Cecil Glenn Hamlin was fingerprinted for an automobile salesman's license. No criminal record. This person listed his date of birth as July 18, 1909 and his residence address as 2422 South Lancaster. Due to the fact that fingerprints or photographs are not available it is not possible to say that this person and SUBJECT are one and the same.

Sir:

Pursuant to the instructions of Captain W. P. GANNAWAY, SUBJECT was interviewed by the undersigned officers and the following report submitted.

SUBJECT resides at 4760 Trail Lake Drive, Fort Worth, Texas with his wife, ELAINA, who is Russian born. They operate a dental laboratory at 1313 East Seminary Drive in that city. Their office telephone number is WA7-2646.

SUBJECT and his wife stated that they met MARINA OSWALD through GEORGE BOUHE sometime in August, 1962. Not long after this, the HALLS said they separated and SUBJECT left town. MARINA moved in with ELAINA and stayed at her house for three weeks in October, 1962, while LEE HARVEY OSWALD was in Dallas looking for a job. On October 20, 1962, ELAINA had a serious automobile accident and was hospitalized. SUBJECT returned to Fort Worth and met OSWALD at this time. This meeting took place at 2703 Mercedes in Fort Worth, which was OSWALD'S residence at that time.

On December 25, 1962, SUBJECT and his wife visited the OSWALDS at 602 Elsbeth in Dallas and at this same address on Easter Sunday in 1963. This was the last time that either one of the HALLS saw the OSWALDS. SUBJECT stated that LEE HARVEY became highly agitated whenever the subjects of religion or the free enterprise system in this country were mentioned. The HALLS also mentioned that GEORGE de MOHRENSCHILDT was acquainted with JACQUELYN KENNEDY'S parents, and that he knew the OSWALDS better than anyone. SUBJECT said that MOHRENSCHILDT'S son-in-law, GARY TAYLOR, drove OSWALD around quite a bit, and he is under the impression that TAYLOR is the one that helped the OSWALDS move
