Sirs:

SUBJECT was interviewed by the undersigned officers with the following results.

SUBJECT stated that on Friday November 22, 1963, at approximately 2:15 A. M. a white male, five feet seven inches tall, 140 lbs. with dark hair, entered the LUCAS D & B CAFE, located at 3520 OAKLEY, where SUBJECT is a waitress. SUBJECT stated that this man was positively L. HENRY OSWALD. SUBJECT said this man stated that he was waiting for JACK RUBY. SUBJECT stated that JACK RUBY entered the CAFE a short time later but did not sit in the booth with this man. The man believed to be OSWALD went over and sat with JACK RUBY. SUBJECT stated that RUBY and the man believed to be OSWALD left at approximately 2:45 A. M. At this point in the interview the SUBJECT stated that she could not be sure that this man was OSWALD but if he had a small deep scar on his left cheek, it was him.

SUBJECT stated that a few days after the assassination she received an anonymous telephone call telling her to get out of town or she would die.

Before the interview ended the SUBJECT stated that she could not be positive but she thought the man with RUBY was OSWALD.

Pursuant to the instructions of Captain L.P. Gannaway an investigation of SUBJECT was made and the following information was obtained.

T-1 states SUBJECT was born 10 March, 1923 in San Antonio, Texas. SUBJECT was employed by the Western Union Co. in San Antonio and his credit rating was satisfactory except for one repossession made by an unknown jewelry store in that city. The SUBJECT was transferred to the Dallas office as a teletype operator on April 5, 1959 by the Western Union Co. and has been employed by that organization since that time. According to T-1, SUBJECT's credit rating in Dallas is satisfactory. T-1 states SUBJECT's home address is 6549 Lake Circle, telephone RA 1-0560. T-1 also states SUBJECT is single and has previously lived at the following addresses in Dallas: 4114 Junius; 3637 McFarland; 2146 1/2 N. Harwood; 4224 Fresscott, Apt. 3.

The indices of the Records Bureau of the Dallas Police Department were searched by clerk Pat Siwick and the following arrest record of SUBJECT was revealed:

- 1 July, 1959, charge D&D, address, 4114 Junius.
- 12 February, 1956, charge D&D and Resisting Arrest, address 2507 N. Fitzhugh
- 26 June, 1962, charge Disturbing the Peace, address 4102 Bowser.

The indices of the Identification Bureau of the Dallas Police Department were searched by clerk Crocgaland with negative results on SUBJECT.

The indices of the Dallas County Sheriff's office were searched by Deputy Kitchen with negative results.

Pursuant to the instructions of Captain W. P. Gannaway SUBJECT investigation was conducted with the following results.

SUBJECT, who resides at 5906 WOODVILLE, has been an employ of the TEXAS SCHOOL BOOK DEPOSITORY, HOUSTON & ELM, for seven months. SUBJECT stated that he knew LEE HARVEY OSWALD when he saw him but that he did not associate with him. He stated that OSWALD stayed by himself most of the time. SUBJECT stated that he was in the entrance of the building when the President was assassinated. SUBJECT stated that he did not see anyone leave the building after the shots were fired. SUBJECT stated that on the day of the assassination he saw OSWALD only one time and that was at 10:00 A. M. SUBJECT said he had never seen JACK RUBY until he saw him on television.
