Sir:

On November 22, 1963, at approximately 2:50PM, the undersigned officer met Special Agent James Hosty of the Federal Bureau of Investigation in the basement of the City Hall.

At that time Special Agent Hosty related to this officer that the Subject was a member of the Communist Party, and that he was residing in Dallas.

The Subject was arrested for the murder of Officer J.D. Tippit and is a prime suspect in the assassination of President Kennedy.

The information regarding the Subject's affiliation with the Communist Party is the first information this officer has received from the Federal Bureau of Investigation regarding same.

Agent Hosty further stated that the Federal Bureau of Investigation was aware of the Subject and that they had information that this Subject was capable of committing the assassination of President Kennedy.

Sir:

On November 22, 1963 I was assigned to the Texas Mart as part of a security force under the supervision of Captain C. A. Jones. After hearing of the President's assassination I, along with Lt. C. L. Cunningham, J. B. Tony, and W. A. Sahn, was instructed by Captain Jones to proceed to the scene of the assassination.

Through the police radio that Officer J. D. Tippit had been shot in Oak Cliff and a suspect had been seen going into the library at E. Jefferson and Aramis. We proceeded to this location and upon arriving found it to be false.

We left the library and heard a report that a suspect fitting the description was seen in the Texas Theatre, 291 W. Jefferson, and was hiding in the balcony. We proceeded to this location and I began searching the balcony. I started down the stairs and heard someone shout, "I've got him down here". I went downstairs and assisted in arresting Lee Harvey Oswald. At this time, Officer W. A. McDonald had this subject and was attempting to take a pistol out of his hand. I along with numerous other officers grabbed Oswald and someone took the pistol out of his hand. Handcuffs were then placed on the subject. At this time the prisoner began shouting "It's not resisting and it's precluding police brutality". We were instructed by Captain Embross to get the prisoner in a car and take him to the City Hall. At this time Detective R. W. Carroll and other officers took the prisoner out the front door of the Theatre where there was a large crowd of people gathered outside. The people were shouting "kill him" and "let us kill him". The prisoner was placed in a squad car and immediately taken away.

I along with Lt. Cunningham and J. B. Tony remained at the Theatre and took the names and addresses of the occupants of the Theatre. We brought a witness to the City Hall who saw Oswald in the Theatre and who also heard the pistol click when it clicked as Officer McDonald attempted to arrest Oswald.

Subject: Arrest of Lee Harvey

Sir:

On November 22, 1963, Officer W. E. Lyon and myself were in the 300 block of East Jefferson assisting in the search for the person who shot and killed Officer J. D. Riggitt.

We heard the police radio report that a suspect had entered the Texas Theater. We went to this location Code 3. When we entered the theater, we were told by a white female that the suspect was in the balcony.

We went to the balcony and searched it. While in the balcony, I heard someone shout that he was on the lower floor. We started down. Lyon slipped and sprained his ankle; I continued on down. When I arrived at the lower floor, Lee Harvey Oswald was resisting vigorously. Sergeant Jerry Hill, Officer E. McDonald, C. J. Walker, and my partner, and myself converged on Oswald. At this time I observed a pistol with the muzzle pointed in my direction. I grabbed the pistol and stuck it in my belt and then continued to assist in the subduing of Oswald. After Oswald was handcuffed we were instructed by Captain W. H. Southbrock to take him directly to the City Hall.

When we removed Oswald from the theater, when we were removing Oswald from the theater, he was hollering that he had not resisted arrest and that he wanted to complain of police brutality. There was a crowd in front of the theater yelling, "Kill the dirty 'lob'." We put Oswald into police equipment #200 and drove directly to the City Hall. While enroute to the City Hall, I released the pistol to Sergeant Jerry Hill. The officers who brought Oswald to the City Hall were myself, Sergeant Jerry Hill, Detective Paul Bentley, W. E. Lyon, E. H. McDonald, and C. J. Walker. Enroute to the City Hall, Oswald was belligerent and said very little except that why was he being arrested other than for having a pistol.

Upon arrival at the City Hall, Oswald was taken to the Homicide and Robbery Bureau Office and there released to officers of that Bureau.

Sir:

At approximately 2:00PM this date the undersigned officer were enroute to the vicinity of the 300 Block West Jefferson to aid in the search of the killer of Officer J.D. Tippett. At this time we received information over the radio that the suspect had run into the Texas Theater. We went to that location along with other officers. We searched the balcony and then went to the lower floor. At this time the suspect was located. Officer McDonald was the first one to him. At this time the suspect hit McDonald and drew the pistol from his belt. At this time myself, Jerry Hill, Ray Hawkins and another uniform officer converged on the suspect. As we all became involved in the scuffle I observed the muzzle of the suspect's pistol pointing at me. I grabbed the pistol and kept it in my possession until I later released it to Jerry Hill. We took the suspect directly to Homicide & Robbery Bureau and there released him to Homicide Officers. While in the process of attempting to get to the suspect Officer K.E. Lyons sprained his left ankle.


Sir:

At approximately 11:00 AM I was assigned to the jail just outside of the jail office. Our instructions were to keep the passage-way clear when we observed Oswald being brought out.

The News people were all asked to stay out in the drive and to keep the passage-way clear. They were also asked not to ask Oswald any questions, as Oswald was being brought out.

As Oswald was brought out, the passage-way was starting to fill up, I stepped a little behind and to Oswald's right to try and prevent anyone getting to him from this side.

I heard a shot and then turned to see several Detectives take subject into custody. As he was restrained I observed, what appeared to be a .38 caliber snub nose revolver being taken from his right hand.

At approximately 11.00 am Sunday, November 23, 1963 I along with several other officers was assigned to the passage-way leading from the jail office to the street ramp. At approximately 11.30 am we observed Lee Harvey Oswald being led from the jail office.

As the officers and Oswald approached where I was standing I observed Jack Ruby push his way toward Oswald. I observed the gun in Ruby's hand and observed him shot Oswald in the side. Just before Ruby got to Oswald I recognized Jack and shouted "Jack you S .O. B. don't do it".

As Oswald fell to the floor I helped pick him up and carry him into the jail office, where we placed him on the floor. I used my key to take the hand-cuffs off of Oswald and the homicide detective. I asked and was told to also take the other set of hand-cuffs off of Oswald.

At this time I helped pull his shirt up and observed the place where Oswald was shot. At this time I asked Oswald if he had anything that he wanted to tell us. I also asked if he had anything that he wanted to have us tell anyone. Oswald did not make a statement that I heard.

I stayed in the jail office with Oswald until he was placed on the cot and taken to the hospital.

Pursuant to the instructions of Captain W. P. Gannaway SUBJECT investigation was conducted with the following results.

The indices of the office of Confidential Informant T-1 revealed that SUBJECT and his wife CLARA ANN ENGLAND O'DONNELL reside at 11009 MYATICE, DALLAS, TEXAS. They have been living at this location since 1961. There is a none list telephone at this location listed to ANU MO SM. The number is DA 7-8344. SUBJECT was born in DALLAS, TEXAS June 7, 1932. His last employment was listed at WESTERN GEAR CORP. 2514 IRVING BLVD., DALLAS, TEXAS. He was previously employed by the DALLAS WINDOW CLEANING CO. located at 2624 SWISS AVENUE and prior to he was employed by the FORD RADIC CO. located at 200 WEST JEFFERSON DALLAS, TEXAS. SUBJECT gave a previous address of 546 ECHEN STREET, SHREVEPORT, LOUISIANA.

The indices of the Records Bureau of the Dallas Police Department revealed that SUBJECT has the following arrest records: August 12, 1949 Inv. Burglary, No Disposition; May 5, 1950 Inv. Theft, No Disposition; May 13, 1950 Inv. Burglary, No Disposition; June 18, 1956 Alias Tickets, No Disposition; October 21, 1958, Capias Profine, No Disposition; October 21, 1959 Affray, No Disposition; September 7, 1960 Alias Ticket, No Disposition. SUBJECT gave his address as 4522 LAKE AVENUE, DALLAS, TEXAS on all of these arrests.

The following report is submitted for your information.

Memorandum to Captain W.P. Gannaway, dated December 2, 1963 pertaining to LEE HARVEY OSWALD. Quote "The undersigned received information from a confidential source that approximately two weeks prior to the assassination of President of the United States John F. Kennedy, SUBJECT made application for employment at the Allright Parking System, 1208 Commerce Street. Signed Bob K. Carroll, Detective, Administrative Section.

On January 23, 1964 the undersigned officer interviewed Mr. Eubert A. Morrow, W/1/, who is one of the managers at the Allright Parking System, 1208 Commerce Street, RI-3-4348. Mr. Morrow's residence address is 2334 McAdams, FE-1-1346.

Mr. Morrow stated that approximately six or seven days prior to the assassination of the President of the United States John Fitzgerald Kennedy SUBJECT came to the parking lot asking for a job. Mr. Morrow stated that while talking to him about the job, SUBJECT asked him how high the parking lot building was and if it afforded a good view of Dallas. Mr. Morrow stated that at the time SUBJECT was applying for employment he was dressed in a dirty white T shirt and blue jeans, and was carrying a newspaper, and that it was during the early morning hours. Mr. Morrow stated that the last time he saw SUBJECT he was waiting to talk with Mr. Claude Hallmark another one of the managers. Mr. Morrow states that the reason he remembers SUBJECT so well is that he wrote SUBJECT'S name down, and that he thought the name was Osburn, but that when he called SUBJECT Mr. Osburn, SUBJECT corrected him and told him that the name was Oswald. Mr. Morrow related that two of the employees also observed SUBJECT while he was at the parking lot. These employees are: Frettt Montgomery, C/M and Charlie Dabbs, C/M. Frettt Montgomery is still employed at the parking lot, but Charlie Dabbs is no longer there. Mr. Morrow did not know the residence addresses of these two employees and the personnel files were not available at the time of this interview.

Pursuant to the instructions of Captain W.P. Gannaway the undersigned officers conducted an investigation at the Allright Parking System, 1208 Commerce Street. The following report is the results of that investigation.

The undersigned interviewed Mr. Garnett Cloud Hallmark, the General Manager for the Allright Parking System. Mr. Hallmark stated that he was not present when SUBJECT is reported to have applied for a job, and that no written application was made by SUBJECT for employment. Mr. Hallmark stated that he does not believe that SUBJECT was at the location. He thinks that perhaps some of his employees are mistaken.

The undersigned interviewed Mr. Hubert A Morrow for the second time and Mr. Morrow's statement is still the same as it was in the report regarding SUBJECT dated January 23, 1964. Mr. Morrow was shown five (5) identification photographs and he positively identify SUBJECT as being the man who made application. The identification numbers used for this identification are as follows: 49218; 54018 (SUBJECT); 49242; 49231 and 49152.

The undersigned interviewed Mrs Viola Sapp for the second time. Her statement remains the same as in the report regarding SUBJECT dated January 23, 1964. Mrs Sapp was shown the aforementioned identification photographs. She selected SUBJECT'S photograph, but stated that she could not be positive that he was the person in question. She stated that she had been real busy and had not paid very much attention.

The undersigned interviewed Mr. Emmett P. Montgomery, 1803 Fuller Drive, BA-7-1086. This was the first interview with Mr. Montgomery as he was not present during the initial investigation. Mr. Montgomery stated that he was present when SUBJECT applied for employment. He stated that he could not remember how SUBJECT was dressed. He stated that SUBJECT was at the location at approximately 8:00AM to 9:00AM. He stated that SUBJECT stayed at the location approximately thirty (30) minutes. Mr. Montgomery was shown the aforementioned identification photographs and he selected the wrong photograph. He selected photograph number 49152
