JACK LEON RUBY, aka. LEE HARVEY OSWALD - VICTIM CIVIL RIGHTS

On the night of 12/19/63 Captain O. A. JONES of the Dallas Police Department who has been coordinating the police department's investigation of RUBY's shooting of OSWALD, advised that he had completed part of the report and taken it to Chief CURRY. He said that it lacked some drawings of the basement area showing where each officer was standing at the time of the incident and the officers' identities. CURRY, who had previously stated that he would give this office a copy of the report, was asked by me if he would be able to furnish us a copy of the report at that time. He stated that it was not complete. He stated that he had to give a copy of the report to the Attorney General, meaning the Texas Attorney General, a copy of the report to the City Manager, one copy to District Attorney HENRY WADE and one copy to the President's Commission. I asked CURRY if he had been asked by the Commission for a copy of his report and he replied by saying he was to meet next Tuesday with BAREFOCT (meaning the U. S. Attorney BAREFOOT SANDERS) and Dean STOREY (ROBERT STOREY, former Dean, SMU Law School and past President of the ABA). He stated that STOREY was a representative of the Texas Attorney General to the President's Commission and he, CURRY, was going to try to find out what would be required of the Dallas Police Department by the Commission in the way of reports or other material.

It was rather obvious that CURRY had not intended to say anything about this meeting with BAREFOOT SANDERS and Dean STOREY since he said after he started the conversation "Of course, this is off the record and I don't want to get in trouble with these people" or something to that effect. changed the subject.

It is to be noted that ROBERT STOREY traveled to Washington last week with Attorney General WAGGONOR CARR for the purpose of meeting with the Commission. VED/11

as to what instructions, if any, were given by the Commission to CARR or STOREY. It is not known exactly as to what author ty STOREY has for receiving information from other sources in behalf of the Commission. It is also to be pointed out that CURRY and STOREY are very close personal friends.

It is also to be noted that STOREY, who is past President of the American Bar Association and a former member of the President's Civil Rights Commission, is allegedly a close friend of Chief Justice WARREN.

These observations are being made for your information.
