Dear Harold:

Fred and Marlynn Newcomb just left Saturday. They came the 21st of November intending to just stay until the 26th but they were having a good time and decided to stay a few more days. I haven't had the time to get down to send you more of Curry's book but I shall go either today or tomorrow and get some more. I gave them all I had at the house to take back to California with them. Incidentally, I kept all file cabinets locked the entire time they were here.

Fred did go through all my old newspapers and found many things he apparently had not known. In some cases, I have gone to the libraries and copied (notEs) from the microfilm and Fred read those notes. He was most interested in a piece I had copied from the Fort Worth Press of December 1, 1963. It was a long article and I only copied a couple of paragraphs into my notebook. Fred asked me to type it up and send it to him and I made an extra copy for you. You have probably seen it but in case you haven't you may be interested.

I had an opportunity to visit with the Martinez family Saturday night. I have known them for many years. They own El Fenix. I told Irene (Martinez) Garcia that several years ago in New Orleans at a party there was a lady there and after she left someone told me her name was either Dolores Neal or Nealy and that she was related to the Martinez family in Dallas. Irene said there was no Dolores in their family at all. She must have been one of the Cuellar family who own El Chico. There was a Dolores Neeley in the Dallas City Directories in 1955 and 1956 who worked for Ben Jack Cage (do you remember the insurance man who created such a scandal and a swindle and had to flee to Brazil in 1956?).
