Since one of Davison's fellow spies, Robert German, was from Dallas, the whole affair may have gotten good coverage. I am interested in anything on Davison, but especially any indication that his parents (Mr. & Mrs. Hal D.) were known to the Dallas Russian community. Perhaps you could check the social pages or the files of the local papers.
