

land policeman John Frey was shot to death with his own .38-caliber service revolver during a scuffle with Black Panther cofounder Huey P. Newton, 3½ years ago.

The testimony by John E. Davis, chief criminologist for the Oakland Police Department, was given at Newton's retrial on a manslaughter charge stemming from the incident.

Newton's defense contends that Frey was accidentally shot by fellow officer Herbert Heanes, who responded to Frey's radio call for assistance after stopping Newton's car in the pre-dawn hours of Oct. 28, 1967.
