widow, the body of Judge Harold J. Haley, killed in the Aug. 7, 1970, Marin County courthouse shootout, was ordered exhumed so that Ruchell Magee can try to prove he was not the judge's killer.

Judge Richard E. Arnason approved a motion by Magee's attorney that a new autopsy be conducted on an undisclosed date.

Magee, sole survivor of four kidnapers who took Haley hostage in his courtroom, hopes to prove that police bullets killed the judge during a wild gun battle outside the Marin County civic center.

Magee and Angela Davis, the former UCLA faculty member who is accused of supplying the guns, are charged with murder, kidnapping and conspiracy.

Antibusing Law

MONTGOMERY, Ala. Gov. George C. Wallace signed into law a bill permitting parents to remove their children from their neighborhood schools if they are convinced busing will harm them.
