'Memoirs' Request Delays Davis Trial

SAN RAFAEL, Calif.—Angela Davis' trial was delayed yesterday with her attorneys asking for suppression of "personal memoirs" they indicated expressed her love for black revolutionary George Jackson.

The trial was scheduled to start yesterday. But the arguments on suppression alone were expected to take up to three days. Superior Court Judge Richard E. Arnason also had to rule on a motion to move the proceedings to San Francisco.

Court observers expected the trial might be put off until late this year or early next year.

Miss Davis, the 27-year-old black militant, Communist and former UCLA faculty member, is accused of murder, kidnaping and conspiracy in the Aug. 7, 1970, Marin County shootout in which a judge and three others were shot to death.
