

### Davis Diary

SAN JOSE, Calif. — A judge has ruled that jurors can hear an edited version of a controversial love diary from Angela Davis to George Jackson, which the prosecution considers crucial to its case.

Prosecutor Albert Harris Jr. edited the 18-page diary to seven pages, but Superior Court Judge Richard E. Aronson has termed that version unacceptable.

Instead, the judge in Miss Davis' murder-conspiracy-kidnaping trial further trimmed the document—sources said to 2½ pages—and told attorneys this version would be ruled admissible "if it was offered."
