

Davis Trial ^{Paul} 5-16-72

SAN JOSE, Calif.—Angela Davis wore a black pixie-style wig and was traveling under an assumed name when she was arrested in New York City more than two months after a bloody 1970 courthouse gun battle, an FBI agent testified.

FBI agent Lawrence J. Monroe took the stand as the prosecution neared the end of its case and testified that Miss Davis and David Poindexter were traveling as Mr. and Mrs. George Gilbert when they were arrested at a motel on Oct. 13, 1970.

In Miss Davis' handbag, Monroe testified, he found nine credit cards in the name of Lorean Robinson, a Board of Elections card in the name Lorean Robinson and a Social Security card, medical insurance card and an identification card in the name Lorean Poindexter from Roosevelt University in Chicago.
