Damore, who wrote the book "Senatorial-Privilege: The Chappaquiddick Cover-Up," collected 150 pages of notes and interviews.

After two years of research, Damore told us, "I persuaded many government and intelligence officials to talk for the first time about the case. They agreed that Mary Meyer was murdered because she knew too much. Some very powerful people feared that Mary knew the real secret of the JFK assassination."

A retired police detective who worked on the case added: "Her murder was the work of a professional assassin. I got the impression the federal government was involved. Pressure was put on our department to be done with the case quickly."

Damore's explosive research now belongs to Davis, who's using it for his book, "JFK and Mary Pinchot Meyer: A Tale of Two Murdered Lovers."

The book is due to be published in 1998 — 22 years after The ENQUIRER first revealed the affair between JFK and Mary Meyer in a 1976 front-page story.
