CHICAGO—Mayor Richard J. Daley is the latest politician to have his words of wisdom collected into a book of quotations.

It remains to be seen whether Chicago aldermen will begin carrying around the green-covered paperback as Chinese workers do the red-bound "Quotations From Chairman Mao."

But nowhere can Mao equal such honest-to-goodness Daleyisms as:

"They have vilified me, they have crucified me, yes they have even criticized me."

Or, the oft-quoted:

"Together we must rise to ever higher and higher platitudes."

Pocket Books of New York has published the 124-page "Quotations from Mayor Daley" compiled by Peter Yessne.

One chapter, "Daleyana," is devoted to the Mayor's celebrated battle with the English language. There are such beauties as:

"Ladies and gentlemen of the League of Women Voters."

"I resent the insinuos."

"That is unreasonable reasoning."

And—

"For the enlightenment and edification and hallucination of the alderman from the 50th Ward."
