

TWO CONVICTED OF MOB ACTION

LSU Student Is One of
Four Charged

CHICAGO (AP) — Two Milwaukee men were sentenced to 30 days in jail Monday as the first persons convicted of mob action in demonstrations during the Democratic National Convention.

Gary D. Dodson, 25, and John L. Schintgen, 22, were also fined \$250. Two co-defendants, both Iranian exchange students, received one year's court supervision for charges stemming from the same incident.

They were Ebrahim Kateb, 27, and Feraldoon Pedrami, 29, both of Chicago. Kateb is a senior at Louisiana State University and Pedrami is a senior at the Missouri School of Mines.

Police said the four men threw rocks at patrolmen on Aug. 29.

Two newsmen charged with disorderly conduct were granted continuances Monday.

Their attorney said they were assigned to cover the presidential campaigns.

Stuart Loory, 36, a reporter for the Los Angeles Times, and Erwin Knoll, a reporter for the Madison, Wis., Capital Times, were ordered to appear Oct. 21 before Magistrate Lewis Gilberto.

Loory and Knoll were arrested and charged with disorderly conduct Aug. 29. They are free on \$250 bond.

A disorderly conduct charge against Miss Gail A. Carter, 27, of 1345 Madison Park, Brooklyn, N. Y., was dismissed.
