**Bomb Hunted
As Agnew Talks**

YORK, Pa., Sept. 6 (AP)—
Three floors of the hotel in
which Vice Presidential candi-
date Spiro T. Agnew was
speaking were evacuated and
searched Thursday night after
a bomb threat was called
into the hotel switchboard and
the York Gazette and Daily
Newspaper office.

The calls, from a woman,
came shortly before 9 p.m.,
about the same time Agnew
began his talk. He continued
his talk while the third, fourth
and fifth floors were searched.

**Muskie Scores Agnew
On 'Anarchy' Remark**

Sen. Edmund S. Muskie, the
Democratic vice presidential
candidate, yesterday said his
Republican counterpart, Gov.
Spiro T. Agnew, performed a
"disservice" in saying the
youths who took part in dem-
onstrations at the Democratic
convention were part of an
"unconscious anarchy."

Agnew offered that charac-
terization in a speech at York,
Pa., on Thursday.

Muskie told newsmen yes-
terday, "It is a disservice to
label all members of a group
with one label." He said some
of the demonstrators were de-
liberately inciting trouble but
many were not.

Muskie also said he hoped
there would be televised de-
bates between the vice presi-
dential candidates, as well as
the presidential candidates,
this year.
