Media Beatings Under FBI Probe

WASHINGTON (AP)—Atty. Gen. Ramsey Clark today ordered an FBI investigation into the beatings of newsmen in the streets of Chicago.

A spokesman for the attorney general issued a terse statement but refused to make further comment on reported brutality by the Phicago police for

tality by the Chicago police force during demonstration in connection with the Democratic National Convention.

The announcement of a federal investigation into the attacks by Chicago law enforcement officers came after reports that so far 24 newsmen have been injured in street incidents involving police.

Presumably the FBI probe will extend to the activities of federal law enforcement officers—FBI men themselves, members of the Secret Service, and persons under their control in the Chicago amphitheater where the convention is being held.

Official protests have been made by several newspan is, the major radio and television

networks and a newspaper union, mostly to Chicago officials, concerning the incidents outside the hall. The protests have brought promise of greater care in dealing with newsmen reporting demonstrations.

New Pueblo Talks Are Arranged
