Thank you very much for your letter of the 4th and its enclose. For your convenience I enclose a copy of your letter and of two pages of the enclosure, to which I refer below.

Two of the records listed in the enclosure, Nos. 492 and 1042, are of considerable interest to me and probably to others.

As the comment on 1042 says, there was a time when it was thought that Lee Harvey Oswald was somehow involved in the death of Martin Schrand. The official inquiry concluded it was suicide.

What the Commission published is inadequate. I'd appreciate copies of the pages it did not publish. Pages 2-12 of 492 are published in the Commission's appendix but pages 1 and 13-20 are not published. None of 1042 is published.
