Final preparations were made by a Dies subcommittee yesterday for the opening today of what promises to be a prolonged congressional hearing on conditions in Japanese

At the same time Chairman Dies (Democrat) of Texas announced the full committee had decided to inquire into the causes behind recent racial disturbances, such as last week's Detroit rioting which took more than a score of lives.

Committee investigators already in the field, he said, had turned up evidence which led him to predict "important developments."
