## Klein Will Get Call to Tell Of Dodd Connections July 19

The Senate Ethics Committee said yesterday that foreign agent Julius Klein will be called to testify July 19 about his connections with Sen. Thomas J. Dodd (D-Conn.).

Klein, a Chicago public relations man, is expected to be the last witness in the first phase of the Committee's hearings on improper conduct charges against Dodd.

Dodd has been accused by syndicated columnists Jack Anderson and Drew Pearson of serving as an "errand boy" for Klein, a registered agent for West German business interests.

At hearings last month, one of Dodd's former aides charged that the Senator made a 1964 trip to West Germany to shore up Klein's image with his clients. Dodd said he made the trip to interview a Russian defector and assassin for the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee.

Meanwhile, the Department of Justice has said that it has begun inquiries to determine whether Klein should have

registered as an agent for the Rheinmetall munitions firm of Dusseldorf.

Assistant Attorney General J. Walter Yeagley said in a letter to Findley that Klein's

reported work with the Defense Department for Rheinmetall appeared to be strictly commercial. But he added that "further inquiry along this line is also being made."
