Dodd, late yesterday denied that his plane fare to Los Angeles had been paid both by the Senate and the Los Angeles Junior Chamber of Commerce.

Dodd, under investigation by the Senate Ethics Committee on miscounduct charges, said the Los Angeles Jaycees had invited him to be the principal speaker at their an-nual banquet and had expressed hope that Mrs. Dodd would accompany him.

"In view of the Chamber's suggestion that Mrs. Dodd accompany me and in view of the fact that she did accom-pany me," he added, "my office evidently assumed that Mrs. Dodd's air transportation would be paid and the payment was for her air transportation."

The Senator said he has offered to reimburse the Jay-cees for his wife's fare and had so advised them yesterday.
