RE BLACK ORGANIZING PROJECT aka

On May 27, 1968 there was a meeting at Bethlehem Baptist Church at 273 Inglo, between the police department and a P.T.A. committee from Carver High School along with representatives of a local black power group known as the INVADERS.

The police department was represented by Fire and Police Director Frank Holloman, and Chief Henry Lux. There were approx. 25-30 people there, and those known to informant were as follows:

1. Rev. R.W. Taylor, pastor of Bethlehem Baptist Church.
2. City Councilman James L. Notters.
3. Oreo McKenzie, member of the Invaders.
4. Richard Cabbage, of the Invaders.
5. Verdell Brooks, of the Invaders.
6. (FNU) Norwood, Invaders.
7. Ewall Famion, (phonic) (A. E. Famion)

The older people at the meeting seemed to agree with Director Holloman, about "maintaining communications in the areas", but the local black power advocates known as the Invaders, did not go along with this belief.

Ewall Famion, (phonic) stated "the police department is putting you down," he further said that the negroes should gain complete control of the whole community.

The meeting was from 5:00pm till approx. 6:00pm. No incidents took place.
