Mounties Said to Steal Cuban Papers

TORONTO, Nov. 10 (AP)—The Royal Canadian Mounted Police absorbed another blow today when a Toronto newspaper said the Mounties stole files from a Cuban trade mission in Montreal in 1972.

The Sun reported that the Mounties took documents amid confusion created by a bombing in which one Cuban was killed. Cuban exiles in Miami claimed responsibility shortly after the blast and the Mounties in 1975 denied a report that they were involved. involved.

The Sun said the Mounties were working with the FBI in an attempt to link the Cuban mission, American militants of the Weathermen and Black Panther groups and suspected terrorists of the Quebec Liberation
