sUBjECT: ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY, 11/22/63, DALLAS, TEXAS

On 11/26/63 Major ROBERT H. ERDRICH, 112th Intell1gence Corps Group, New Orleans, personally came to this of ilce and advised he understood ve were interested in the ...ns Fair play for Cuba Commitee in connection with the investigation of this case and for this reason wanted to furnish the following information:

He advised that one of the l12th Agents sometime during the last week in May or the first week in June, 1963, picked up a handbill of the Fair Play for Cuba Committee which was attached to a wall on the campus of Tulane University. This handbill was approximately $8^{\prime \prime} \times 11^{\prime \prime}$ and was faded green in color. The ll2th Intelligence Corps Group subsequently found additional copies of this handbill laying on Canal Street and others laying on the grounds of the port of Embarkation, New Orleans. Some of the bills found by the 112th were faded green and some were faded orange.

On 6/18/63 Major ERDRICH's office sent one of these
bills to their beadquarters at lashington, D. C., and maintained a photograph of one of the bills in the files of the 112th. Major ERDRICH advised be would obtain photographic copies of this photograph and would furnish them to the New Orleans FBI Office.

The bandbills in question read as follows:

JOIN THE FAIR PLAY FOR CUBA COMMITTEE.
