In response to your memorandum of April 5, 1975, to [REDACTED] this is to advise that the Secret Service has only two requests under the Freedom of Information Act for material concerning the assassination of President Kennedy and the Warren Commission's findings.

These letters, from [REDACTED] and Mark Lane, are attached.

Lane and [REDACTED] have written books and treatises on the Warren Commission's findings since the Warren Commission's reports were published. [REDACTED] is mainly concerned with the trajectory of the bullets and the "one bullet" theory concerning the wound of John Connally and the wound suffered by President Kennedy from the same bullet.

[REDACTED] and is actively engaged in the present controversy concerning the reopening of the investigation.

The replies to these letters have been coordinated with [REDACTED] the Office of Chief Counsel. Essentially we have denied Mark Lane any information and referred him to the Archives to which he had also addressed his inquiry. In the case of [REDACTED] we sent him photostatic copies of some documents which we had previously furnished the Commission and which are in the Archives available to that source.
